SPEAKERS BIO



Dr. Timothy Domer, MD ABHPM is widely known for his numerous Intensive Case-Based Training sessions and Conference presentations on Dementia and Palliative Care in many parts of the USA. He graduated from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine and also held a Geriatric Medicine and Palliative Care Fellowship at the University of New Mexico. Since 1992 he has been working at Fort Defiance Indian Hospital, New Mexico in various capacities including Staff Internist & Clinical Director and is currently Director of Home Based Care/Elder Care Programs.

Dr. Christine Jamieson, MA., LTh., PhD (St. Paul) is an Associate Professor and Chair in the Department of Theological Studies at Concordia University where she teaches courses in Clinical Ethics and Theology. She is presently on a shared Academic Fellowship with the Centre for Clinical Ethics and the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. Since 1999 she has been doing research for Health Canada.

Dr. Aslam Daud, M.B.B.S. is a Medical professional with extensive experience in health care management applications with several certifications in Health Care and Information Technology. He is currently working as Senior



Healthcare Systems Analyst and was also a member of the Advisory Committee to the Minister of Health. He is the Chairman of Humanity First – Canada.

Venerable Man Yee Shih, BSW, RSW co-ordinates interfaith relations & Dharma Education activities at the Fo Guang Shan Buddhist Temple of Toronto. A graduate from Thunder Bay University in Social Science she was a past social worker in Hong Kong.
