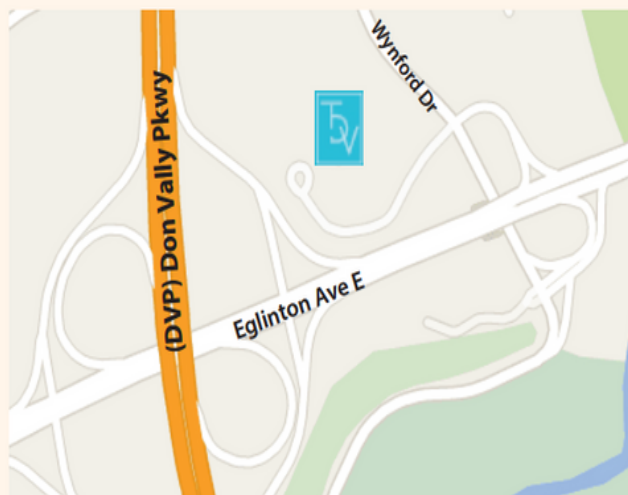

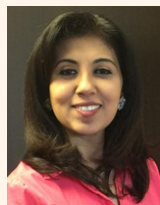
Ms. Stéphanie Pagano
