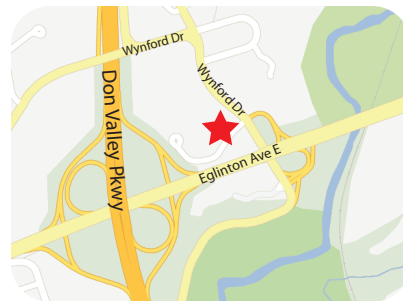

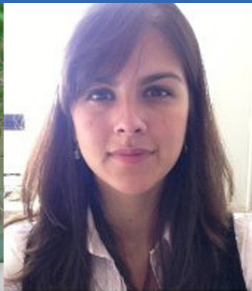

Speakers' Bios

Dr. Sr. Helen Prejean, CSJ, PhD (HC)

A member of the Congregation of St. Joseph, she serve as a teacher of religion and in 1981 moved into the St. Thomas Housing Project in New Orleans to be with the poor and worked at Hope House till 1984. During this time, she was asked to correspond with a death row inmate Patrick Sonnier, she agreed and became his spiritual adviser. After witnessing his execution, she wrote a book, *Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the Death Penalty in the US* and it became an award winning movie and an opera. Since 1984, Sister Helen has divided her time between educating citizens about the death penalty and counseling individual death row prisoners. She has accompanied six men to their deaths, & she began to suspect that some of those executed were not guilty. This realization inspired her 2nd book, *The Death of Innocents*.

Hon. Justice Edward Ormston

He graduated from the University of Ottawa Law School in 1971 and was a Crown Prosecutor and Defence lawyer before being appointed to the Ontario Court of Justice in 1989. He was an initial Director of the Ontario Justice Education Network. He was instrumental in the development of the First Mental Health Court in Canada in the City of Toronto.

Dr. Pamela Cushing, MA, PhD

She completed her doctoral studies in Anthropology at McGill University and is an Associate Professor in Interdisciplinary Programs in Western University, ON where she teaches courses on *The Social Construction of Disability Across Cultures* and *Violence in Socio-Cultural Perspective*.

Rosalind Abdool, BA, MA, PhD (Cand)

She is a Clinical Ethics Fellow, Centre for Clinical Ethics & University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. She specializes on Mental health Ethics and also has contributed to research on person-centred value integration in the delivery of care in the clinical setting.

Dr. Joseph Chandrakanthan, PhD (Ottawa), ThD (St. Paul)

He is an Associate Professor at the University of Toronto and Clinical Ethicist at the Centre for Clinical Ethics and the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. As a specialist in Multicultural Ethics he has addressed a number of national and international conferences.

Mr. Steve Abdool, RN, MA, PhD (Cand.)

Trained in the United Kingdom as a RN he works as Staff Bioethicist at the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics & St. Michael's Hospital and is also Director of the Regional Centre for Ethics at Homewood Health Centre in Guelph. Steve has presented at several national and international conferences and conducts interactive training session in various colleges and universities on healthcare education.

Dr. James A Anderson, MA, PhD

He was Senior Research Associate in the National Core for Neuroethics at the University of British Columbia, and a Post-Doctoral Fellow in the Biomedical Ethics Unit at McGill University and was an Academic Fellow in Clinical and Organizational Ethics at the Joint Centre for Bioethics, University of Toronto.

Ms. Mary-Lou Martin, RN, MScN, MEd

She is a Clinical Nurse Specialist at St. Joseph's Healthcare, Hamilton and a Clinical Associate Professor at McMaster University. Her research interests include therapeutic relationships, transitional care model, trauma-informed care and smoking cessation. Currently she is chair of the Forensic Mental Health Nurses section of the International Association of Forensic Mental Health Services.
