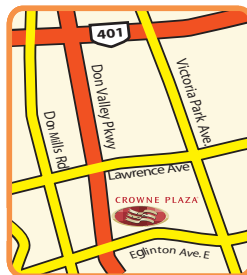

Dr. Joel Sadavoy

Dr. Joel Sadavoy, M.D., F.R.C.P.(C)

Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Toronto; head of the geriatric psychiatry and Community Psychiatry programs, inaugural holder of the Sam & Judy Pencer and Family Chair in Applied General Psychiatry at Mount Sinai Hospital. He has published widely and has contributed to many textbooks on general and geriatric psychiatry. He served as Senior Editor of all three editions of the Comprehensive Textbook of Geriatric Psychiatry, (2004) and is also the author of Psychotropic Drugs and the Elderly, (2004).

Dr. Nalaini Sriskandarajah, MD

Psychiatrist practicing in New York, USA. In addition to many Public Lectures, Radio programs and publications on Mental Health, she also volunteers with Physicians for Human Rights and has been providing trauma evaluations for the asylum network for families and individuals from many countries around the world. She has also served in the aftermath of tragedies including the 9/11 attacks on the World Trade Center, the South Asian Tsunami Disaster in Dec 2004 and Hurricane Katrina in the Fall of 2005.

Dr. Vicky Stergiopoulos, MD, MHSc, MSc.

Staff Physician, Mental Health Service, St. Michael's Hospital (SMH); Medical Director, Inner City Health Associates; Scientist in the Keenan Research Centre of the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute of SMH; and Assistant Professor, Department of Psychiatry, University of Toronto. Her work focuses on education, clinical program development and mental health services research related to marginalized populations.

Nimo Bokore, BSW, MSW, RSW (Toronto).

She is a survivor of Horn of Africa's civil wars and a graduate of Ryerson University and University of Toronto. Having worked extensively with many professionals, displaced groups and undocumented migrants in Toronto now she works as a Therapist at a Community Health Center for black women and women of colour and teaches at Humber College Social Service Workers Program.

Dr. Rex Roman, BA, MA, PhD (Toronto)

He served for many years at the Ministry of the Attorney General and the Office of the Chief Justice and also held a Fellowship with the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. Dr. Roman who led the demographic study of mental health resource allocation in the Mississauga Halton LHIN is currently a Fellow in Mental Health and Ethics with the Department of Psychiatry at Women's College Hospital, Toronto.

Venerable Dr. Geshe Lodoe, BA, MA, PhD (Gaden).

He became a Tibetan Buddhist monk at the age of ten under the guidance of His Holiness Dalai Lama. He studied Buddhist Psychology and Ethics at three leading Buddhist Universities in India and Tibet. He taught Buddhist philosophy in many Colleges and Universities in the USA.
